1 egg

Mix together fruits, sugar and tea, cover and leave overnight

Add beaten egg and then flour, stir well.

1 tsp bicarbonate of soda
½ tbsp. ground ginger
225g (8oz) golden syrup
100g (4oz) margarine
100g (4oz) light brown sugar
2 eggs
¼ pint (150ml) milk
Sift flour, bicarb of soda and ginger together
Melt syrup, margarine and sugar
Gradually beat in milk and allow to cool
Add beaten eggs and mix well
Stir in flour mixture and pour into greased tin
Bake for 7 approx.. 1 ¼ hours at 150°C, 300°F, gas mark 2.
